Martha Henry, Dismas Ministry Board Member

Since joining the Dismas Ministry Board of Directors in June 2023, Martha Henry has been busy. From day one of her service on the Board, Martha has rolled up her proverbial sleeves and is eager to help strengthen our mission to support the spiritual lives of men and women behind bars.

A lifelong Catholic, Martha is inspired to serve others in the Church as well as neighbors in her community of Cresco, Pennsylvania. Though she hails from California, she has lived and worked in different parts of the country. Martha now enjoys retirement life – but not an idle one – in the shadow of the Pocono Mountains.

"I have a passion for serving those that need a second chance in life. I want to be able to reach out to people who

seek a positive change in their lives," said Martha, whose work in special education provided experience for helping those among the most vulnerable.

She has had family members who spent time in prison, and understands how people become involved in activities that lead to prison. Martha wants to help be a part of the solution in preventing someone from heading down that path, encourage someone making meaning of a life behind bars, and support those reentering society.

As a community volunteer, Martha is active with several organizations close to home. Among them, she has served in leadership roles with both her Catholic parish and Philanthropic Educational Organization (PEO), an organization that provides scholarship support for women's education.

In responding to the needs of those served by Dismas Ministry, Martha strives to develop an understanding of how people end up in prison. Then, design ways to help individuals while they are serving time, and explore options to support them upon their release.

"I am a firm believer in thinking about walking in the shoes of another. And further, I believe in offering services and visits to meet the spiritual needs as well as perhaps the learning needs of those incarcerated."

Martha Henry is a Dismas Ministry board member based in northeastern Pennsylvania. Born and raised near San Francisco, California, she holds a bachelor's degree in communications from the University of Montana at Missoula, and a master's degree in special education from the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs. Martha is a retired teacher. A devout Catholic, she is a parish volunteer and serves as treasurer of her local chapter of the Philanthropic Educational Organization (PEO). She and her husband, Jim, enjoy outdoor activities and spending time with family.

Dear Friends,

It is a busy time of year for Dismas Ministry. There is great energy that elevates our mission and this is due, in large part, to the prayerful and financial support from YOU – our friends and benefactors.

Behind the scenes, there are more than two dozen team members dedicated to our cause: three fundraising and marketing professionals, and 25 volunteers. Even though I'm immersed so intently in the day-to-day operations of our small nonprofit, I never forget that our mission is far reaching and touches many lives – every day of the year.

We receive letters from prisoners, their family members, and chaplains who express gratitude for the ways in which we support imprisoned men and women on their individual

faith journeys. Here's a message from Willis which gives an indication of the impact of our work:

"Thank you very much for the information on the courses you offer. I apologize for not taking action yet, but have had some health issues - it happens when you are 75 - and haven't had the chance to talk about it with my chaplain before deciding.

Please keep praying for the Catholic community here at the State Prison. Compared to the Evangelicals, we're quite small. When COVID came we lost our priest, and only recently have restarted having Mass ableit once monthly. Please pray that a way can be found for a priest to come in weekly and that other Catholic programming will open up for us. Again, thank you so much for thinking of me. We are Home for the Holidays

In spring 2023, we announced the difficult news that Cardinal Stritch University in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, was closing its doors – after 86 years – following the spring stry operations had been part of the Stritch company since 2019. Our organization's operation

commencement. The Dismas Ministry operations had been part of the Stritch campus since 2019. Our organization's operations continued onsite, while the search began for our next new home for the Ministry.

Our quest to find new workspaces best suited for our needs was blessed with a special opportunity.

Gus Ramirez and the Ramirez Family Foundation purchased the former Cardinal Stritch University campus in July 2023. And, Dismas Ministry was invited to remain as part of the onsite community that is under development.

The newly acquired north shore location will become the home of a second St. Augustine Preparatory Academy – a private, Christian school for students in K4-12th grades. The school's flagship campus, located on Milwaukee's south side, opened in 2017. Known as "Aug Prep" in the community, they will begin welcoming students to the former Stritch campus in 2025. The Dismas Ministry Board of Directors, staff and volunteers are grateful to everyone at the Ramirez Family Foundation and Aug Prep for the opportunity to work alongside them. We are "home" and our doors are open to partner with them and others, both near and far, who are committed to supporting our Christian faith-based missions.
